	20-09-2022	<p>Complaint No. <u>FOH-HQR/0000170/2022</u></p> <p>Complainant Humaira Jabeen and Respondent Syed Zia Ullah Shah present in person.</p> <p>They are husband and wife. Complainant Humaira jabeen, although, is still a legal wedded wife of the Respondent but resides separately along with her son due to strained relations between the couple. Respondent has contracted second marriage and resides with his children from his second wife.</p> <p>Complainant Humaira Jabeen has also a son studying in class 9. She along with her son lives in her parents' house. Through the instant complaint the Complainant alleged that she is being ignored by her husband and is living the life of a helpless person. Further alleged that Respondent also ignores his son who needs financial help at this stage. Respondent was summoned. He committed before this forum to provide a separate house to the Complainant and also maintenance to his son. Today Respondent appeared and said that he has hired a house for the Complainant in H-13 where she along with her son may conveniently</p>

reside. Further stated that he has been receiving a salary of Rs.34,000/- per month and out of this salary he is ready to pay Rs.8,000/- as maintenance to his son. It appears the financial position of the Respondent is not sound, whereas he has to bear the expenses of his children of two wives. Respondent complained that he is not being permitted by the Complainant side to meet with his son and deliberately such conditions are created to compel his son to be inimical towards him. Complainant is not willing to shift to the house hired by the Respondent in H-13. After considering the above facts, I thought it appropriate that the Respondent be asked to pay the sum of Rs. 15,000/- to the Complainant for maintenance of the wife and child. Complainant on her own option will reside for the time being with her parents, and that she or her brothers will not create any hindrance in the way of Respondent to meet his son once in a week. The child may accompany his father to visit the places he likes from dawn to dusk. The child would be, however, returned back to his mother before the sunset.

Matter is disposed off accordingly.
